Caleb - champion gymnast

Caleb Alan Jones was born on 28th April 2000 at 30weeks weighing 1620g. He had a relatively uneventful 7week stay in NICU and it was after discharge that Caleb faced his biggest hurdles.


First when he caught the RSV bug at 9weeks actual which caused him to stop breathing at home and my husband and myself had to perform CPR, it also landed him back in hospital for another 3weeks with 2 collapsed lungs on the ventilator. Then when he was 2yrs old he had a poisoning accident and had severe acid burns in his airway and lungs, the only thing that saved his life that day was the brilliant surgeon who performed a tracheostomy.

From Caleb's early traumas I always said he was destined for great things because there had to be some reason why after so many times of coming so close to losing him that he survived each and every time but I never thought it would be what Caleb informed my husband and myself only a couple of months ago: "I was born to do gymnastics and be an Olympic champion". So far he is heading in the right direction having just won the 2008 Hunter Region Men's Artistic Gymnastics Level2 U/8's

Championship, bringing home 5 gold medals from 6 apparatus and the overall champion trophy.

All that's left this year is to conquer the NSW State Championships and Country Championships. His coach is also expecting him to be selected for the NSW State Development Squad next year which means every 2months Caleb will train with the NSW Institute of Sport for the weekend. I'm so very proud of my 'bubba' and every time I see him swinging around on the rings or hand-standing on the parallel bars I can't help but think how far he has come in the last eight years.



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Mitchell - champion soccer player and swimmer

Mitchell and his twin, Antony, were born at 29 weeks on April 12, 2000. Mitchell weighed 1339g and Antony weighed 1191g. Antony passed away at birth due to acute TTTS. Mitchell spent 10 weeks in hospital and came home on oxygen for 9 months. He had intensive speech therapy for 2 ½ years and a small amount of physiotherapy. He is now 8 years old and his school results are excellent with him excelling in maths, science and technology.

Mitchell plays soccer for Mt Gravatt Hawks in Brisbane. Out of the 75 Under 8 players, the club has selected about 15 players who were ready for a little bit more advanced skills training and Mitchell is one of those. He has so far scored over 40 goals this season.

He attended a Brisbane Premier League game at the Brisbane Strikers about a month ago to watch his eldest brother play and there was a penalty shootout competition at halftime for Under 9s and younger. Mitchell participated and even though he wasn't officially the winner (a player from the home team was given the prize), he did score the most goals and was named the winner by our club.

Mitchell has found swimming a challenge but this year he was promoted to Level 4 and will be learning butterfly meaning he will be capable of swimming all 4 strokes. I am constantly amazed by the efforts of my little guy and can hardly believe he was once my tiny little baby who wasn't expected to live.

Samuel - champion survivor

Sam was born at 23 weeks and 6 days on the 24th of August, 2007. He spent 118 days in the hospital and was out just after his due date which was just before Christmas, a fantastic Christmas present.

Sam is now nearly 12 months old, 8 months corrected and doing wonderfully (sitting unsupported at times and trying to crawl forwards but only going backwards!!).

His latest accomplishment is the progression from a nasal gastric tube to eating solids, although it hasn't enticed him to drink anything!! It is so nice to see his little face without tape on it.

Emily was born at 28weeks and 6days weighing 1.1kgs. She was breathing on her own from day 1 and was only on CPAP for 9 days.

Emily was discharged after 69 days and now weighs 2.96 kgs.

BJOG Release: Stop Smoking If You Are Pregnant

"New research to be published in *BJOG: An International Journal of Obstetrics and Gynaecology* examines the results of maternal smoking on birth outcomes.

Previous studies have focused on the consequences of smoking during each pregnancy, in isolation. This new study analysed outcomes according to whether women continued to smoke in successive pregnancies, or managed to give up smoking after their first pregnancy. Previous pregnancy outcomes were compared to subsequent pregnancy outcomes in the same sample population."


